Quill Soup by Alan Durant, illustrated by Dale Blankenaar, published by Tiny Owl

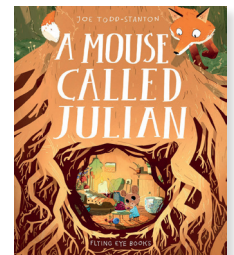

When a fox invites himself for dinner, creative thinking and a cool head get Julian out of a very strange situation. Size is no indication of ability in this story about two unlikely friends.

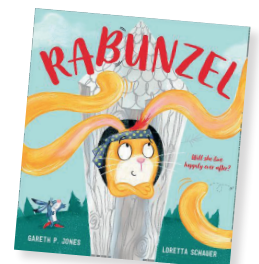
