

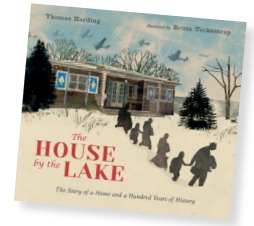
Whole Book Class Reading Suggestions

by Thomas Harding, illustrated by Britta Teckentrup, published by Walker Studio

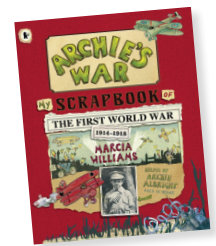

Rabbit loves to paint and make music, so when he disappears his friends are devastated. But Rabbit has left them a parting gift: ways to make beautiful colours and sounds, and lots of happy memories. A story about how we hold onto those we love, and the impact they have on us. *Picturebook*

by Lane Smith published by Macmillan

Each fantastically-shaped hedge marks an event or memory in Grandpa's long and active life, and Grandpa tells their stories as his great-grandchild helps him in the garden. *Picturebook*

by Paul Fleischman and Bagram Ibatoulline, published by Walker Book

An old man encourages his great-granddaughter to explore the tiny objects hidden inside his collection of old matchboxes. They tell the story of a journey across the sea and new life in a distant land – a life that has been full of books and happy memories. *Picturebook*
