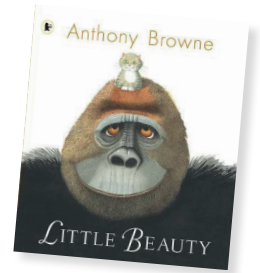


Whole Book Class Reading Suggestions

A gorilla has been taught to use sign-language, giving his keepers get an insight into the way he views our world. A simple story raises complex questions about how we communicate, and why we need to learn about the creatures with whom we share our planet. *Picturebook*



Greta and the Giants by Zoe Tucker, illustrated by Zoe Persico, published by Frances Lincoln

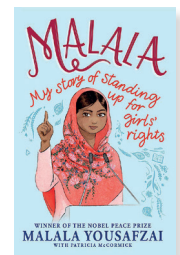
The giants are chopping down the forest and destroying the animals' homes. So Greta and her friends use placards to get their message across and help the giants understand what's really happening. *Fictional picturebook*



Malala: My Story of Standing Up for Girls' Rights

(Illustrated Edition for Younger Readers) by Malala Yousufzai with Patricia McCormick, published by Wren and Rook

Malala's first-person narrative tells the story of her early life, explains why she was attacked and expresses her belief in the importance of education for everyone. Background information is provided. *Chapter book adaptation of her memoir for ages 7+*



Street Child by Berlie Doherty, published by HarperCollins

Jim's story of living by his wits on the Victorian streets makes a powerful case for care and education for every child. Inspired by the true story of Dr Barnardo and the orphans he met in London. *Middle-grade modern classic*



Clean Up! by Nathan Bryon, illustrated by Dapo Adeola, published by Puffin

When she finds too much plastic on a Jamaican beach, Rocket decides to educate her fellow holidaymakers and form a Clean-Up Crew in this picturebook with added facts. *Picturebook*
